ARTICLE II. - SECURITY OFFICERS

Sec. 26-19. - Town Security Officers.

During the period of time that the office of Town Marshal is not filled, those individuals who served in the capacity as Deputy Town Marshals shall serve in the capacity as Town Security Officers.

Sec. 26-20. - Controlled by Council.

Security Officers shall serve at the pleasure of the Town Council.

Sec. 26-21. - Appointment.

The Town Council shall appoint such Security Officers as the Council deems appropriate and necessary.

Sec. 26-22. - Duties.

It shall be the duty of the Security Officers of the Town to issue citations for violations of Town ordinances, provide security for the Town and the residents thereof, at the time and in the manner prescribed by the Town Council or their duly appointed Police Commissioner.

Sec. 26-23. - Chief of Security.

The Town Council may designate One of the appointed Security Officers to be the Chief Security Officer and confer upon the Chief Security Officer such duties and responsibilities as the Town Council deems appropriate.

Sec. 26-24. - Exceptions.

Nothing herein shall be construed to confer upon Security Officers of the Town police powers as set out in IC 5-2-1-17 or any other similar law conferring police powers on law enforcement officers.
